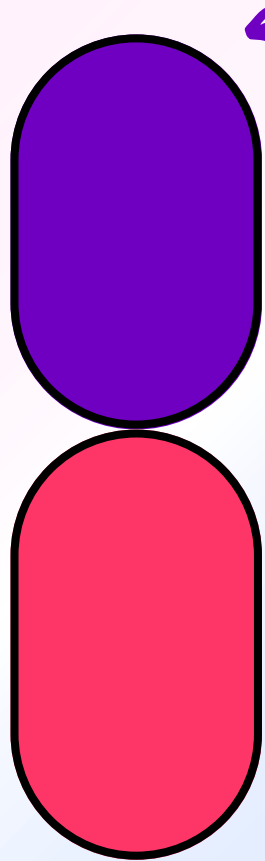

Result of the renovation of the Haarlem Ice Rink

Last season, we were unfortunately forced to cancel our final shows due to the renovation of the middle rink. However, the result has been very beneficial for the club, as we have gained many more opportunities in the 2020/2021 season. But what exactly happened?

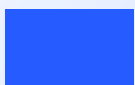


New, extra, center lane

This new rink is slightly smaller than our regular rink, but it's not much different. It's essentially one large ice rink, but it can be separated. On some lesson days, we'll rent both rinks, giving us one large ice surface—how cool is that?!

Old familiar center lane

We'll also be using our familiar rink frequently this winter for our training sessions. While the newly added ice rink has ice hockey boards, our familiar rink still has soft boards.

tunnel exit

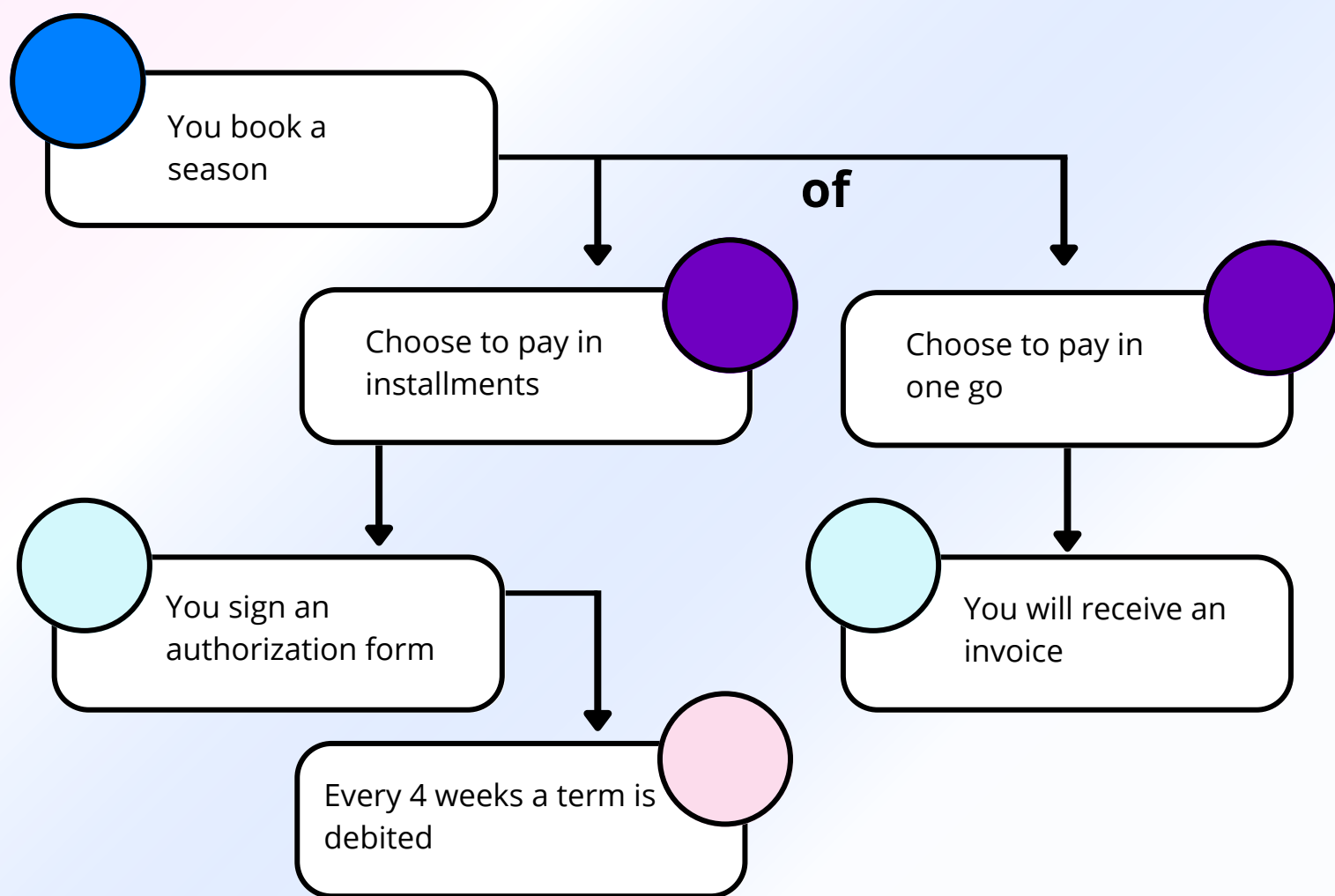

Payments

Last season, payments were made by invoice, but this wasn't always an ideal solution, so during the season, payments will be made by direct debit. The only exception is if you choose to pay in one installment, which is then done via invoice.

Schematic overview:



- **When paying in installments, a surcharge of €3.50 per installment applies. We must charge this fee due to the extra costs and work involved in installment payments.**

Catch-up policy

Missed lessons can always be made up, but there are rules:

For the make-up lesson, send an email to info@ksvhaarlem.nl stating your intention to make up the lesson and which missed lesson it concerns.

- Maximum 4 catch-up lessons per hour, maximum 5 catch-up lessons per season.
- In cases of maximum ice coverage, overtaking is only permitted in exceptional cases.
- To make up for a missed lesson, you must also have unsubscribed from the missed lesson.

Passes

To access the center court for your class, you'll need a pass. Existing members might already have a pass, and the new season will be loaded onto their old pass. Lost your pass? Send an email to info@ksvhaarlem.nl to request a new one.

We are currently working with the ice rink to arrange the proper access to the passes. Due to strict privacy regulations, we are handling this carefully. More news will follow.

Don't forget your pass! This causes unnecessary stress for the volunteers who check it and sometimes leads to unpleasant commotion.



PS: Your pass only grants access to your lesson(s) at KSV Haarlem. Unfortunately, you cannot use your pass during public hours unless you have bought tickets or a bought subscription that is put on your pass by the cashier of the Ijsbaan. Haarlem.

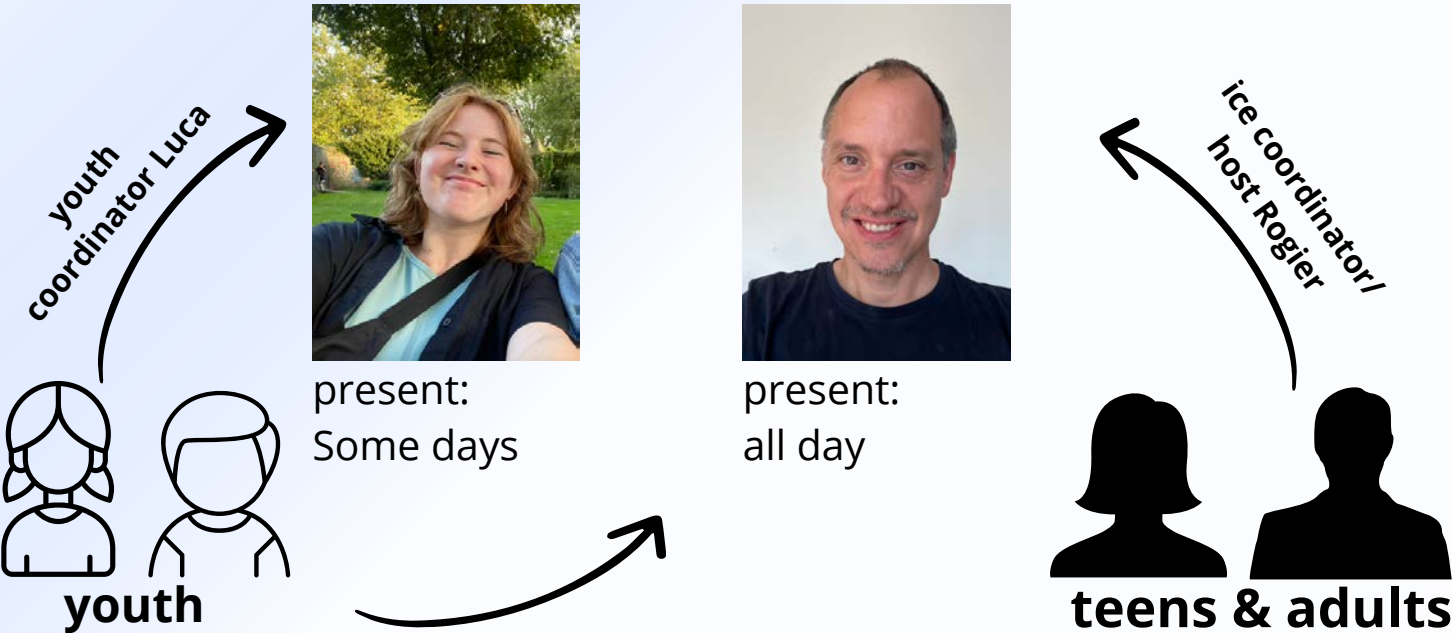

wristbands and lease skates

The 24/25 winter season was wonderful. Lots of new faces, new initiatives, fun events, and much more.

The leasing skates have been successfully implemented with the option to take them home and try them on before the season, and we'll continue with that this year.

Another problem we as a board faced was that our members did not always know where to be on the ice and which trainer to contact.

Last year, we experimented with colored wristbands, and this pilot project was a huge success, so we'll continue using them this season. Experience has shown that it's only really necessary for the first few weeks, because after that, everyone knows where to be. Check the table lists beforehand to see which color group you belong to and put on a wristband that's on the table. This way, you'll not only immediately recognize who's in your group, but also who you need to be with on the ice.

And as with everything, your chairman will also act as host in the 25/26 season, so if there is a problem or you don't know where to go, you can always ask Rogier.

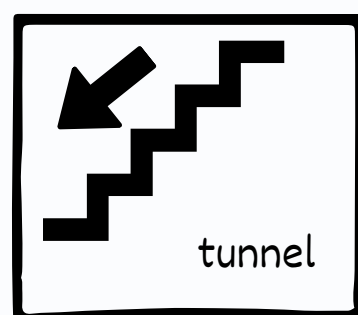
Clothing

Athletic pants are handy. It's also best to wear three thin layers of clothing. For example, thermal underwear, a sweater, and a jacket.

NOTE: Gloves required

How do you reach the center lane?

- First, enter through the entrance of the ice rink.
- In the hall, you can indicate at the ticket desk that you are coming for a trial lesson at KSVH, you can mention Rogier as your contact person.
- In the hall, simply go straight to the doors. On the left you will find Maarten's restaurant and on the right the skate shop. Just keep walking straight.
- After passing through the doors, you can already see the center rink.
- Turn right! Ignore the skate rental shop on the right. Even if you have rented figure skates for your trial lesson, you will find your skates at the middle rink, not at the ice rink's skate rental shop.
- Continue until you see the tunnel and go through it. After that, everything is self-explanatory. Chairman Rogier will also be hosting your trial lesson, so if you have any questions, please feel free to ask.

- **Statement of conduct**
- **Professionally trained trainer-coaches**

Association-wide codes of conduct:

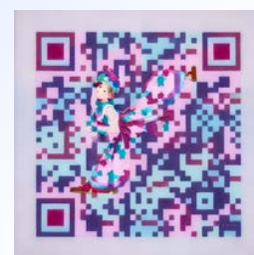
